

THESE \$0 SERVICES COULD SAVE YOUR LIFE



You don't want to get sick. Nobody does. And you certainly don't want to end up with a major medical problem. One great way to avoid these issues is to develop healthy habits like getting regular exercise, eating sensibly, and making sure you get an annual checkup with your doctor. Your doctor can help you determine if, following your checkup, you need important tests for things like breast cancer or prostate cancer. These important \$0 preventive screenings could, in fact, save your life, and they come with your health plan.

Medications that might be covered

Your health plan covers these medications with no cost share when prescribed by a licensed provider and obtained at an in-network retail pharmacy:

Contraceptives – Most generic oral contraceptives for women are covered at an in-network retail pharmacy or through mail order.

Smoking cessation medication – Over-the-counter (OTC) generic nicotine replacement products like patches and gum; generic prescription drugs such as bupropion; and brand prescription drugs like Nicotrol®, Nicotrol® NS, and Chantix® are covered for up to 6 months of treatment.

OTC generic medications and supplements – Aspirin, folic acid, iron, and oral fluoride, among other generic OTC medications, are covered as preventive when prescribed by a licensed provider.

Cholesterol treatment– If you meet certain criteria, statin therapies, including Lovastatin and Pravastatin, are covered as preventive therapies when prescribed by a licensed provider.
