Newport Public Schools Instructional Mandates - Summer School

No. 6350

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The Newport School Department shall offer a summer school program that shall provide opportunities for remedial and ramp-up instruction for students who have not achieved standard on the state assessments. This standards-based "safety net" program shall align with the academic expectations of the school district. Student skills shall be tested upon entry into course and again at the conclusion of the course.

The faculty for the summer school shall be drawn from the regularly employed teaching Newport Public Schools teaching staff whenever practicable.

The superintendent shall ensure that information regarding courses and programs is published early in May of each year and that all relevant information about the summer school program is promptly conveyed to all members of the Newport school community, including parents and guardians of students.

In the fall of each year, the superintendent shall report to the school committee on the summer school session.

The report shall include but need not be limited to the total number of students enrolled; the enrollment by course; the distribution of test scores received by pupils in ramp-up courses; the roster of teachers and subjects taught, and a financial statement.
