Newport Public Schools Instructional Mandates - Adult Education

No. 6345

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The Newport School Committee recognizes the need for a robust Program of Adult Education opportunities to be offered to the citizens of Newport.

GED (General Educational Development) Programs, English/Language Learner Programs, and Programs for various job certifications are important for the residents of Newport. The Executive Director of Teaching, Learning, and Professional Development will continue to ensure that standards for Graduation Requirements of Rogers High School are met in the Diploma Plus Program.

School Committee is supportive of the development of such Programs and will work with its community partners in promoting Adult Education. The Superintendent shall, on behalf of the School Committee, provide direct and substantial input to community partners who provide the Adult Education Programs in the City.

On an annual basis, the School Committee shall receive an update from the Superintendent on Adult Education Services in Newport.
